

1 910 . COMMUNITY RELATIONS

2 **1. Purpose**

3 The Board of Education feels it imperative that communication be maintained in both directions between
4 the public schools of the district and such local institutions, organizations and groups as industry, business,
5 labor, charity, and other special interests which make up the structure of the community.
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7 **2. Authority**

8 The Board has authority over the pupils in its care, but shares that authority to a limited extent through the
9 cooperative training programs that take certain pupils into the community during part of their educational
10 career. To make those experiences meaningful, the Board feels cooperation is essential with the
11 community.
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13 **3. Responsibility**

14 The Board authorizes the establishment of a community liaison committee of staff members and
15 community representatives to identify community resources, services and needs for such purposes as
16 vocational training programs, cultural institutions training capabilities, field trip possibilities, special
17 lecturers for in-school programs, industrial and business assistance programs.

19 Any programs which develop from community cooperative efforts require Board approval prior to
20 implementation if given for credit.

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22 In reviewing these matters, the administration shall keep in mind that the schools

23 shall maintain an impartiality among all constituents of the community who promote worthy
24 causes.

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28 shall not be used for direct sales promotion of goods or services.
